In the name of the + Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

HYMN

Christians, awake, salute the happy morn whereon the saviour of mankind was born. Rise to adore the mystery of love, which hosts of angels chanted from above; with them the joyful tidings first begun of God incarnate and the virgin's son.

Then may we hope, the angelic hosts among, to join, redeemed, a glad triumphant throng; he that was born upon this joyful day around us all his glory shall display; saved by his love, incessant we shall sing eternal praise to heaven's almighty king.

The Gospel

Alleluia, alleluia.

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory.

The Holy Gospel is written in the 2nd chapter of the Gospel of Matthew beginning at the 13th verse.

- ¹³ When they (the Magi) had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. 'Get up,' he said, 'take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him.'
- ¹⁴So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, ¹⁵ where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'Out of Egypt I called my son.'
- ¹⁶ When Herod realised that he had been outwitted by the Magi, he was furious, and he gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the Magi. ¹⁷ Then what was said through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:
- ¹⁸ 'A voice is heard in Ramah, weeping and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted, because they are no more.'

Reflection

If you are like me, the stories in the three synoptic gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke, can get a bit jumbled up. We have heard them so often that the accounts tend to meld together rather than hold their distinctive emphasis. They are referred to as 'synoptic' because they 'see together' in giving their account of Jesus's life. There are in each of them additions and omissions; but broadly speaking their material is the same and the arrangement the same order.

Over the coming months our gospel readings will come from Matthew's account. So as a challenge to myself I am reading Matthew's gospel as if for the first time – noting just what is there and not what I think is there.

What becomes immediately apparent is that what we take to be the 'Christmas story' so loved by nativity plays is a constructed compilation from Matthew and mostly from Luke. Mark is quiet on the matter – Jesus just seems to bound onto the scene.

In Matthew, it is Joseph who is the significant mover receiving insight and directions from angels three times; protecting Mary from shame and the infant Jesus from those who would destroy him. The magi are the only visitors and Matthew records the terrible actions of Herod ordering the killing of all the young boys in and around Bethlehem.

It is a far cry from the often sentimentalised and sanitised Christmas story. Jesus is born into the harsh reality of a world of fear and violence- - our world. The one who is the light of the world is no stranger to the darkest places in our world today.

Joseph is told that their child is begotten by the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is the creator of the world and the giver of life. So, then, in Jesus there entered the world the very life and power of God. That power, which breathed life into that in which there was no life, is come to breathe life into our sorrows, weaknesses and frustrations.

Jesus came to this world, not for His own sake, but for us and for our salvation. We could put it this way

- we are not really alive until Jesus enters into our lives.

Even our very ordinary lives. Paul's description of the church at Corinth makes this point; not many were of any worth in the 'eyes' of the world. But here again is the upside-down nature of the people of God. Most of us do not account for very much. Paul suggest this perhaps makes more room for God for such people have less to maintain and less to fall from

I have known two people in my life whom the world would barely notice and when they did it was with some derision or pity. Yet the marks of their Christian expression have remained powerfully with me, more so than the shining lights of the 'Christian stage' of that time. It wasn't what they said or did, but who they were. There was an childlike innocence about them, not the innocence of ignorance but an innocence that shamed me. There was a natural humility, alongside an often piercing wisdom, no pretence, seeing the good in others and a thankfulness for life.
