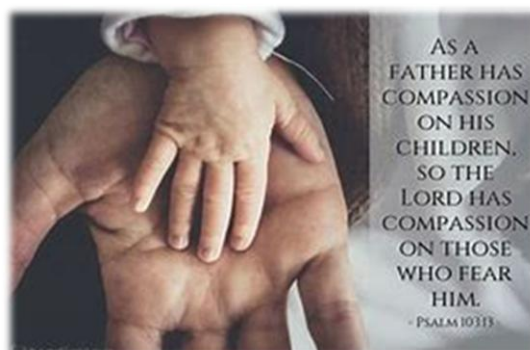
18 His brothers then came and threw themselves down before him. "We are your slaves," they said.

Epistle

Romans 14 1-12

The Weak and the Strong

1 Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarrelling over disputable matters. 2 One person's faith allows them to eat anything, but another, whose faith is weak, eats only vegetables. 3 The one who eats everything must not treat with contempt the one who does not, and the one who does not eat everything must not judge the one who does, for God has accepted them. 4 Who are you to judge someone else's servant? To their own master, servants stand or fall. And they will stand, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

5 One person considers one day more sacred than another; another considers every day alike. Each of them should be fully convinced in their own mind. 6 Whoever regards one day as special does so to the Lord. Whoever eats meat does so to the Lord, for they give thanks to God; and whoever abstains does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God. 7 For none of us lives for ourselves alone, and none of us dies for ourselves alone. 8 If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. 9 For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living.

Matthew 18. 21-35

The Holy Gospel is from the 18th chapter of the Gospel of Matthew beginning at the 21st verse.
Glory to you O Lord

The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

21 Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?"

22 Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.

23 "Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. 24 As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. 25 Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt.

26 "At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' 27 The servant's master took pity on him, cancelled the debt and let him go.

28 "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.

29 "His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.'

30 "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. 31 When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened.

32 "Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I cancelled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. 33 Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' 34 In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

35 "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

Reflection

I suppose if your siblings had decided you were such a pain that they plotted your death – but mercifully (?) sold you into slavery to a passing slave merchant - and then lied to your father that you were killed by animals and worse lived with that lie for years – you might find them hard to forgive. Hard to forgive what they had done and hard to forgive the pain they had caused your father.

We can perhaps imagine what they endured with the passing years. The unspoken, yet shared guilt, remorse and shame. Observing their father's grief must have been unbearable.

The colourful story of Joseph exceeds the supposed colour of his clothes. He had risen from slavery to become the second most powerful man in Egypt, albeit by a pretty convoluted route. Now here is a huge test of forgiveness on Joseph's part. They are in his hand – what will he do? Vengeance is sweet they say, but not as sweet as reconciliation. It is a shining story for both parties had changed.

In this moment Joseph breaks the cycle of deceit and violence by his forgiveness and his brothers stop hiding behind their father's words (if he ever said them?) and weeping, bow before him and ask Joseph's forgiveness on their own account. Joseph weeps with them. His vain, youthful prophetic dream of their bowing before him because he was so great, which caused such animosity, was transfigured for good; turned from evil egotism to good use. They had become a family in reconciliation.

Jesus' almost humorous parable. The amount the first man owed was the total budget for a small country – zillions – and the debt was forgiven, he was released from its burden. But he does not show the same mercy to another and fusses for the few pounds he is owed.

It is hard to forgive some things. Hard to forgive others, hard also to forgive ourselves. It helps sometimes to detach the emotion from it. If we have to pay a huge bill – we may feel negative in all sorts of ways, conversely if we acquired unexpected money, or put our finances straight, then there are equally positive emotions. Yet in both cases there is simply the movement of money.

Forgiveness is a 'thing' just like 'money', and it has its positive and negative emotions (mostly negative). Forgiving ourselves involves the emotion of guilt, shame, remorse. Forgiving others evokes anger, the need for recompense or justice, or worse, wishing ill events to happen to them. All rather yucky and all rather pointless and causing us to use a lot of emotional energy.

There is a reason why things are consigned to the past, it is because they have passed from our lives. We cannot do anything about the past except, to bless it with remorse and let it go. The 'now' and the future are all we have. It is now that we can make the choices. Keep on carrying it or really consign it to the past. Writing it all down, or as a letter and then burning it, burying a stone which represents the past event. These symbolic actions can help. The symbolic action of bowing before Joseph could not have been easy but the physical action had its effect. It did to both parties, for Joseph, the one so wronged, "wept and spoke kindly".

Forgive us as we forgive others.... We will become gentler and more merciful if we began to understand this better.
